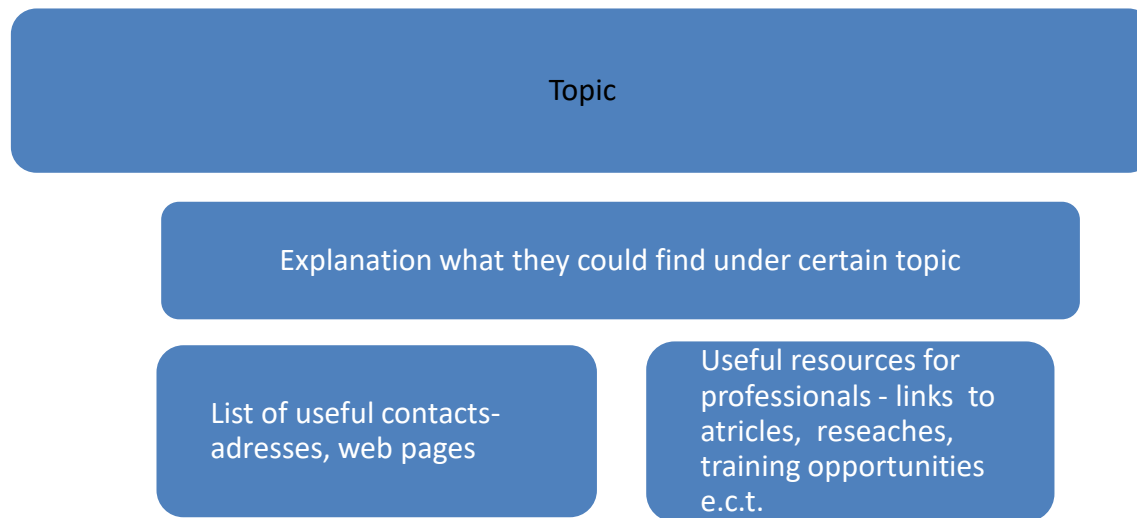


**Proposed structure of on-line Resource guide**

Professional working with careleavers will need information that careleavers pointed out as important to them when leaving care, so resource guide should also follow the structure of future handbook for careleavers considering topics.

If it would be possible (something to think about), beside information that Resource guide should have and that should serve for better and easier informing of careleavers , one more column for professionals could be added – links to useful articles, books, researches, training opportunities for professionals working with careleavers for each topic.



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Topics	Content
Social support and involvement in community	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Support that youth from alternative care is entitled e.g. counselling, guidance, support youth groups and addresses and web pages of organisations that provide that kind of support</li> <li>2. Volunteering – local, national, transnational - addresses and web pages of organisations that organise volunteering</li> <li>3. Leisure time – addresses and web pages of organisations that careleavers can contact</li> </ol>
Education	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Web pages and addresses of organisations with information of night school, retraining, non-formal education and high education</li> <li>2. List of addresses and web pages of organisation that provide professional guidance</li> <li>3. Web pages and addresses of organisations that provide scholarships for youth from alternative care</li> </ol>
Employment	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Lists of addresses and web pages of organisations with information about rights and obligations of unemployed youth from alternative care</li> <li>2. Lists of addresses and web pages of organisations that provide training in preparation for job search</li> </ol>
Financial capability	Lists of addresses and web pages of organisations that give training in financial counselling and management and web resources of useful information
Placement – housing	<p>Lists of addresses and web pages of organisations that provide different possibilities for placement of careleavers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- youth facilities</li> <li>- student dorms</li> <li>- shelters for homeless people</li> <li>- renting a house or room</li> </ul>
Identity information	List of identification documents that careleavers should have and addresses and web pages of institutions where to get them

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Health	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Health insurance – where and how to get it (web pages with information and addresses)</li> <li>2. Obligatory doctors and ways to apply (family doctor, gynaecologist ) – useful web pages</li> <li>3. How and where to ask for help in case of addiction, mental health problems, urgent health issues -useful web pages</li> </ol>
Personal development	Lists of addresses and web pages of organisations that give support and advice considering personal development (love relationships, family relationships, parenting e.c.t.) with specific emphasise on youth from alternative care
Youth with disabilities – additional rights	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Labour market – web pages and addresses that give support to youth with disabilities in job search</li> <li>2. Education - – web pages and addresses that give support to youth with disabilities in education</li> <li>3. Social security - – web pages and addresses that give support to youth with disabilities in obtaining their social rights</li> </ol>
Young mothers	Lists of organisation that provide support to young mothers from alternative care (placement, job search, psychological help and support)

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
